The French critic Philarete Chasles said she was,

• "a boring imitative writer with no substance."

Rudyard Kipling wrote a poem to on her,

' Jane lies in Winchester - blessed be her shade .'

She is one of the world's most widely read authors many of Austen's works are frequently adapted for screen and stage. She has played a profound role in shaping the literary culture.

Jane Austen herself never married and spend a large part of her life relaying on her mail relatives to support her. The reason for popularity of Austen's novel is because of they are intricate social criticism of the world of the rich.

• Features of Austin's novels :

She portrays small groups of people in unlimited environment. She highlights the social hypocrisy through irony. Austin employed domestic realism. Her characters are middle class and provincial. The apparently trivial incidents of everyday lives are moulded into comedy of manners. She contains elements of fairy tales. In her novel heroines are undergo a process of education and self realization. She used delicate economy, subtle irony ,underline moral commentary.

Austin's writing stands out for it's comedy self awareness and realistic detailed portrayals of characters and their relationships. Overall she covers the reality in fairy tale through her characters specially female characters that in the last only way for them is marriage due to economically weakness.

She Paradise the sentimental novel. More emphasize on dialogues than on scenic descriptions. She had an illusion to contemporary fiction. She revealed domestic realism through a traditional style of fiction prevalent throughout the 19th century.

ABOUT AUSTEN'S WORK IN DETAIL :

• Sense and sensibility:

Here I want to start with one of Austen's famous quote from sense and sensibility,

"it is not what we say or think that define us, but what we do."

This novel is Epistolary novel. It appeared in 1811 under the pseudonym **'A lady'**. Here, sense in the book means good judgement and sensibility means sensitivity or emotionality. Elinor as a sense or Marianne is sensibility.

The story is about the romantic attachments heart breaks in marriage of sister Elinor and Marianne Dashwood. The theme of the novel is the need to balance emotion and thought.

As a typical in domestic realismElinor and Marianne both find love and happiness by overcoming the struggles and learning from their mistakes.

This novel is considered as classic for the economy of narrative and elegance of style. She cleverly used gentle irony starting from the opening sentence.
